- Dr. Tucker will present a two-day training on CAMS, a therapeutic framework for suicide-specific assessment and treatment of a patient’s suicidal risk and meets the CDC's criteria as a well-supported intervention for the reduction of suicidal thinking. It is a flexible approach that can be used across theoretical orientations and disciplines for a wide range of suicidal patients across treatment settings and different treatment modalities.
